Guidelines

Please follow these guidelines when using the prayer and meditation space. These guidelines are also posted outside and within each room.

- This is a quiet space. Cell phones should be silent upon entry into space.
- Music or guided meditation audio is permitted only if your use of headphones and does not disturb other students.
- Mutual respect for others is expected at all times.
- This space is intended for meditation, prayer, mindfulness and finding a moment of peace. Please do not use it to study, hold group meetings, eat a meal, or nap.
- Food and beverages are strongly discouraged. Water is acceptable.
- Please be aware and respectful of the personal space of others.
- Please keep the room clean. Please remove all personal materials from the space after use.
 Mats/carpets need to be returned to the designated area. Furniture must remain in the room and restored to the original position. Please do not remove items from the room.
- The use of fire, including lit candles or incense, is not permitted in the room or building.

Respect for Others

All users are expected to demonstrate mutual respect towards the integrity of each other's beliefs, cultures, and traditions. This means that users should respect the freedom of other individuals, within the boundaries of the law, to express their beliefs, traditions, and attire for worship and prayer.
