

# Student Right to Know Graduation/ Completion & Transfer Rates

## July 2020/Cohort of Fall 2016

Pima County Community College District (PCC) provides the following information regarding our institution's graduation/completion and transfer rates in compliance with the federal Higher Education Opportunity Act of 2008. The rates reflect the graduation and transfer status of students newly enrolled at PCC during fall 2016 and for whom 150% of the normal time-to-program completion has elapsed.

In fall 2016, 2,210 first-time, full-time, certificate- or degree-seeking undergraduate students entered PCC. After 150% completion time had elapsed, 20.7% of these students had graduated from PCC and 19.4% had transferred to another institution of public higher education. This gives PCC a success rate of 40.1%.

### Students-athletes Receiving Athletic-based Aid

During the 2016-2017 year, 110 first-time, full-time, certificate- or degree-seeking undergraduate student-

athletes received athletic-based scholarships while enrolled at PCC. After 150% completion time, 34.5% of them completed their programs.
