

Student Right to Know Graduation/ Completion & Transfer Rates

July 2019/Cohort of Fall 2015

Pima County Community College District (PCC) provides the following information regarding our institution's graduation/completion and transfer rates in compliance with the federal Higher Education Opportunity Act of 2008. The rates reflect the graduation and transfer status of students newly enrolled at PCC during fall 2015 and for whom 150% of the normal time-to-program completion has elapsed.

In fall 2015, 2,341 first-time, full-time, certificate- or degree-seeking undergraduate students entered PCC. After 150% completion time had elapsed, 18.5% of these students had graduated from PCC and 18.8% had transferred to another institution of public higher education. This gives PCC a success rate of 37.3%.

Student-athletes Receiving Athletic-based Financial Aid

During the 2015-2016 year, 179 first-time, full-time, certificate- or degree-seeking undergraduate student-

athletes received athletic-based scholarships while enrolled at PCC. After 150% completion time, 36.0% of them completed their programs.

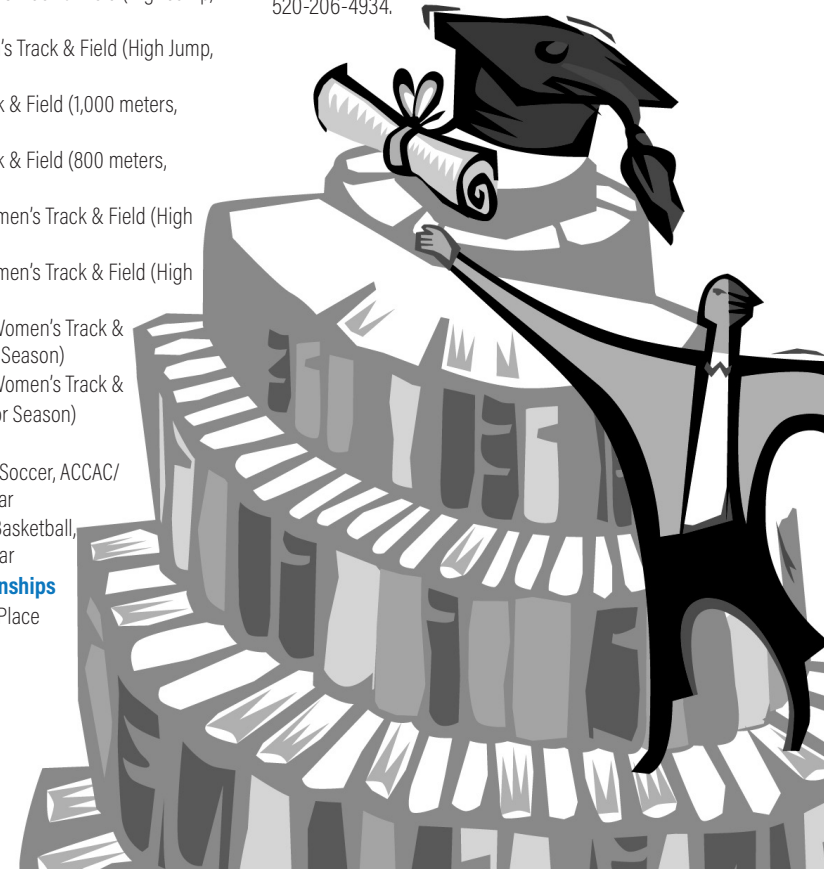
