## Selective Admissions Point Rubric (CAP, LPN-AAS, CEP)

**Accuplacer Reading Assessment Score (10 points):** Scores of less than 250 are not comparable to college-level reading. This does not mean you need to retake the exam if you score below 250, however, students should be encouraged to attend booster camps, complete EdReady remediation, or take college-level reading courses to increase their reading skills and ensure you are more successful in the program.

**PAX Exams\* (maximum 50 points):** Verbal, Science, and Math: Students must turn in a single report with all three scores on the report. Student may not turn in multiple reports for points. Each section is scored separately and all three scores are added together for your total PAX score. Points are based on percentage correct from PAX exam report.

**Preparatory Courses (maximum 40 points):** Must be on a Pima transcript at the time of application with final grade conferred. Assessment into MAT189 or higher will result in ten points. Accomplishing the successful credit-granting score on the College Composition Exam (CLEP) for writing will result in ten points.
