Ireland's rich history can be seen all over its landscape and seascape, from the dramatic Wild Atlantic Way, to the sacred tombs of the ancients, the forts of the tribal chieftains, and the castles of the colonizers. This course in Ireland explores how environment, culture and history have shaped indigenous and post-colonial Irish culture. This trip is a chance to see it all in person, and learn about the people and places that shaped its past while earning Pima credits.

The first half of the course will be completed at Pima, then we will head to Ireland to finish up the class with ISAI, Institute for Study Abroad Ireland.

While in Ireland, your home base is the town of Bundoran, located in the northern part of Ireland and a noted seaside resort.
