Fatima Wilson - asked about protocol for those who are positive for Covid. Ouatfa Chuffe-Moscoso - replied on the process. Fatima asked - if these cases were at a specific campus or one. Outfa replied on how cases are identified and classified. Fatima asked if there will be a report/metrics available Mike Lopez - asked about protocol for visitors. Dr. Dore replied the same as everyone else. Mike Lopez - asked if we're inviting non-PCC guests to the campus. Dr. Dore replied - suspended outside vendors but still including visitors related to PCC events, but with considerations. Ouatfa Chuffe-Moscoso - also clarified the process with vendors.
